One of the main reasons you are reading this prospectus is to find out the type of courses we offer at Forge. We have a wide range of options and are always on hand to provide advice and guidance on what can be a difficult decision. Students joining the Sixth Form can follow either an A level pathway or a vocational pathway made up of BTEC courses. Those following an A level pathway can choose three or four A level courses from the range of subjects listed below.

### **A LEVELS INCLUDE:**

English Literature
Mathematics

Students undertaking the A level pathway will also have the opportunity to study the following subjects: Sport (BTEC), ICT (BTEC), Music (BTEC), Extended Project Qualification and Financial Studies.

We strongly believe that students should have as much flexibility and choice as possible when making decisions about which courses to take. As such, it is possible for a student to create a bespoke timetable that includes a mixture of A level and BTEC courses.

Students opting for vocational courses can choose one of five different pathways made up of level 3 BTEC courses. These five pathways are set out on the opposite page. Each of the pathways enables students to specialise in a specific field of vocational study, designed to equip them with the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary to build successful careers in associated industries and lines of work.

#### **BTEC Health and Social Care**

Leading to careers in nursing, midwifery, social work, mentoring, counselling, psychology, youth work and teaching.

# **BUSINESS PATHWAY**

#### **BTEC Business**

Leading to careers in business, management, IT, administration, customer service, retail, finance, marketing, human resources and web design.

# **ACTIVE PATHWAY**

#### **BTEC Sport**

Leading to careers in sports science, physiotherapy, sport coaching and sport management.

# **CREATIVE PATHWAY**

#### **BTEC Performing Arts and Music**

Leading to careers in music, theatre, performing arts, teaching and music or performance therapy.

# **FLEXIBLE PATHWAY**

#### **BTEC Business with ICT/Sport/Music**

Leading to careers in business, management, IT, administration, customer service, retail, finance, marketing, human resources, web design, sport management and A&R.

The pathway that you follow in Sixth Form will ultimately depend on your interests, longer term career ambitions and your ability to meet the entry requirements set for each subject. 





University courses, degree apprenticeships and quality opportunities are often over-subscribed so it's really important that you leave us with the strongest possible profile and develop a wide range of skills that will ultimately strengthen your university or future job applications. At Forge we fully appreciate the importance of helping to develop our sixth form students as individuals and not just academically. As a result of this, every student has the opportunity to participate in a range of non-qualification activities designed to help make Sixth Form life busy and exciting. In recent years this has included first aid courses, sport clubs, charity events and a reading programme with primary students. In addition, time for work experience is also provided in year 12.

Moreover, as part of a larger Academy community, all students are encouraged to take on a leadership responsibility during their time in Sixth Form. There are many different leadership roles and activities to choose from including subject ambassador, mentor for younger students and senior prefect. Taking on roles like these enable our sixth form students to set the tone of the Academy and fulfil their position as role models for younger students. Many of our sixth form students also enjoy the opportunity to take on a paid position of responsibility acting as a break time supervisor.








In addition to A level and BTEC courses, sixth form students also have the opportunity to build other qualifications into their timetable. We call these our enrichment qualifications and they are designed to further develop study skills, help prepare for life after Sixth Form and improve readiness for the world of work. Moreover, each enrichment qualification attracts UCAS points, which means they can help to secure the points needed to progress to university. In recent years our enrichment qualifications have included:

- Level 3 Certificate/Diploma in Financial Studies
- The Extended Project Qualification
- Level 3 Certificate of Personal Effectiveness
