OUR ACADEMY VALUES

Our core values are at the centre of everything we do. They are our ethos and are everything we stand for as an Academy. As staff, these are values we model - all day, every day.

BACK TO **BASICS**

At Forge, we've always taken great pride in preparing our young people for the world beyond the Academy - into work, apprenticeships or further education. We provide our students with a framework in which they can learn, we call this BASICS - we want our students to simply get the basics right.

Be on time

- All students expected on site at 8.35am and in form by 8.40am. Both side gates will close at 8.35am.
- Any student arriving after 8.40am will be sent to the canteen - they will serve 20 minute after-school detention. If this happens 3 times in one week, a 60 minute detention will be set on the third occasion.
- Any student arriving after 8.55am will be signed in on the late desk and set a same day 60 minute after-school detention

ttend every day

- All students are expected to have at least 97% attendance.
- Attendance to be discussed in form every Monday.
- Parents can track attendance using EduLink (see our Apps section later).

Smartly dressed

- Full uniform is expected for every student and the form tutor will check every morning. Any student not in the correct uniform will be sent to the canteen during form. We will contact home if a student does not have the correct uniform. As always, we will support families who are struggling to provide the correct uniform.
- Hoodies and nose piercings are to be confiscated and brought to the main office.
- We will be using the same system of confiscation as mobile phones for piercings/hoodies, we will be asking students to hand these over and we will return them at the end of the Academy day.

BACK TO BASICS CONTINUED...

nstructions followed

(from a practical point, students will follow this guidance for every lesson):

- Line up quietly outside the classroom where possible.
- Enter the classroom in a calm orderly manner.
- Stand behind chairs with coats off and equipment on the desk in silence.
- Sit down when instructed by staff.
- Complete the Do Now task.

During the lessons students will be expected to:

- Engage fully with learning.
- Listen in silence to staff instructions.
- Complete all tasks set.

At the end of the lesson, students will:

- Pack away in a calm, orderly manner.
- Stand behind chairs with coats on
- Wait in silence for staff to dismiss.

Out of lesson, students will:

- Move sensibly along the corridor.
- Follow one way systems where appropriate.
- Go straight to the next lesson.

Students will be given every opportunity to get this right without consequence but there will be a ladder of escalation:

- Students will be provided with a reminder of expectations.
- Students will be issued with a warning if an instruction is still not followed.
- Students will be given a 'time out' this can be a move within the classroom or a few minutes outside to have a conversation.
- Removal and talk about the behaviour later, this will result in a 20 minute after-school detention. If this happens more than once in a day, the detention will be increased to 60 minutes.

Come equipped

- Tutors will check their form's equipment every morning. We expect all students to carry a school bag and pencil case to hold at least one pen, pencil, ruler and rubber as basic equipment. It is essential that students come organised and ready to study.
- Tutors will provide any missing equipment, students will be issued an sanction three for missing equipment. If there are 3 incidents in a week, the tutor will call home and a 20 minute detention will be set.

Show respect

- Respect for yourselves
- Respect for each other
- Respect for your learning
- Respect for our environment

There will be a number of form activities and PSHE sessions surrounding the theme of respect; students and staff will work closely together on this.

REWARDS AND SANCTIONS

It is important to state that a detention is a last resort for us, we don't want to issue any but there needs to be a consequence of actions. To counterbalance this, we will be ensuring that students are rewarded when they get things right. Achievement points will be issued for out-of-lesson behaviour too. Parents will be notified by EduLink when a student gets an achievement point and we look forward to issuing lots!

Same day detentions ensure that students can start the following day with a clean slate. We want to give students every chance to succeed and it's important that issues don't hang over them. Parents will be informed about detentions via EduLink, if a detention is not convenient we are happy to have the conversation about moving but we need your support with this.

Our detentions will be staffed by our senior leadership team and volunteer staff, it will be based in the canteen and we will encourage staff to come to the canteen for restorative conversations with students.

ACHIEVEMENT POINTS

We use an achievement points system to encourage and reward behaviour that mirrors our Academy values. All staff at the Academy are encouraged to log achievement points for students. We endeavour to ensure ALL students that meet the rewards thresholds (bronze, silver, gold, platinum) are recognised and are in with a chance of winning prizes in our termly celebration assemblies. EXTRACURRICULAR CLUBS

There are many varied extracurricular activities at Forge to allow children to pursue different interests outside the classroom or improve their work. These are rotated regularly and cover a wide range of interests. We regularly update activities for students in the canteen and on our Facebook page. ENRICHMENT SESSIONS

Friday afternoons are dedicated to optional enrichment sessions, that are free to attend for Forge students. All sessions last for 90 minutes from 13.30-15.00.

Details will be sent to every family during our first half term in September.

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD

UNIFORM

REINFORCE STANDARDS

It is important that your children get the same, consistent message on high expectations. Your reinforcement of these expectations is really helpful to us.

PARTNERSHIP

We work best when communication between us is strong. You can always call or email us to discuss any concerns or issues. We will get back to you within 24 hours to discuss the matter you have raised.

Over the course of your time at Forge, you are likely to require some support from our dedicated pastoral team. In year 7 you have a whole raft of options, from your progress tutor to your pastoral leader.

If, as a parent, you would like to speak to a member of the pastoral team, we will be happy to help and will ensure we get back to you to address your concerns within 24 hours.

REGULAR READING PRACTICE

Reading forms the foundation of learning. Listen to your child read for 20 minutes each day. This has been proven to have a positive impact on academic outcomes.

MULTIPLICATION TABLES

Going through these regularly with your child will really help their progress in maths

HOMEWORK AND STUDY

You can use the Satchel One app to regularly monitor your child's homework. Please encourage them to work hard and to complete homework on time.

SOCIAL MEDIA

There are rarely issues here that start inside the Academy. If your child has access to the likes of Facebook, WhatsApp and Instagram, we would encourage you to monitor their usage.

FIZZY AND ENERGY DRINKS

All fizzy and energy drinks are banned at Forge.

If fizzy drinks and/or energy drinks such as *Red Bull, Relentless, Monster Energy* and *Rockstar* are found on site, they will be disposed of.

Please support us in ensuring that your children don't have access to these drinks and encourage them to drink water, squash or healthier alternatives.

MOBILE PHONES

We recognise that many parents may wish their children to carry a mobile phone for use in certain circumstances.

They are a feature of modern life but their misuse or abuse causes problems for the Academy. If a student must bring a mobile phone, it is to be kept in a bag and turned off while in our buildings - they are allocated as NO PHONE ZONES - If mobile phones are seen or heard in classrooms, corridors or the canteen, they will be confiscated for collection at the end of the day. Sanctions will be recorded on SIMS for any misuse.

Students will continue to be allowed to use their mobile phones during break and lunchtimes - outdoors only.

The Academy will not be responsible for any loss, damage or theft of devices brought onto the premises.

UNIFORM

- Black blazer with embroidered Academy logo
- Plain black trousers
- Plain black knee length skirt
- Plain black jumper (optional) (no sweatshirts)
- Shirt/Blouse white (no casual shirts or t-shirts)
- Head scarf (optional) plain black
- Polishable black shoes in a sensible style
- Outdoor coat in a plain, dark colour (not leather/denim)

JEWELLERY

Students are not allowed to wear excessive or expensive jewellery at Ormiston Forge Academy. This is not only to prevent the loss of valuable items but also to encourage neatness in dress and appearance. If studs are worn, only one pair can be worn in earlobes. Nose studs or any visible body piercing are not permitted.

ALL JEWELLERY MUST BE REMOVED FOR PE DUE TO HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS.

MAKE-UP

Make-up and nail varnish are not permitted in years 7, 8 and 9. Discrete make-up and nail varnish is permitted for years 10 and 11.

PE KIT:

Compulsory clothing:

- Black/burgundy polo shirt with Academy logo.
- Plain black football style shorts (cycling style shorts are only to be worn underneath football shorts)
- Plain black tracksuit bottoms (discreet logo is acceptable) OR black tracksuit bottoms supplied via our approved online supplier. Leggings are allowed to be worn underneath football shorts.
- Plain black football socks (outdoor)
- Plain white sport socks (indoor)
- Appropriate footwear for the activity; suitable trainers for indoors and sturdy trainers or moulded stud boots for the astro turf

Often students need to go outside in all weather conditions. They're required to be fully prepared for these conditions with clothing that ensures they are as comfortable as possible whilst still upholding our PE kit standards.

Optional clothing for Winter:

 Black long sleeved sports top with Academy logo - supplied by Crested School Wear.

An alternative to the 'Forge branded' top is that students may wear a plain black sweat top/thermal or skin-top underneath the Forge polo shirt. No hooded tops should be worn for PE lessons. In cases of extreme cold, hats and gloves may be allowed at the discretion of the class teacher.

Edulink has replaced planners at Forge. It gives parents instant access to information about their child including behaviour, achievement points, canteen use, attendance and progress.

ACADEMY DAY


Each morning at 08.35, students should make their way immediately to their first session of the day.

HINGLEYS

Hingleys is our five acre sport facility located a short walk from the Academy. It has changing rooms and a number of pitches, we also hold our sports day there. Students are always escorted to Hingleys by staff.

Hingleys was named 'Hingleys Sports Pavilion' before it was handed to us. It is also a community resource. Hingleys sport pavilion was set up and built by the company who built the Titanic anchor, it was used for their recreational works sports teams.

MOUNTAIN CENTRE

The Mountain Centre is based in Dinas Mawddwy, in the valleys of South Wales, around 90 miles from Birmingham. It offers students the opportunity to pursue outward bound activities away from the more urban environment where our school is based. The centre is a self-catered facility that can hold up to 30 students and six staff per visit.

The Mountain Centre is used by students, staff and governors throughout the academic year for:

- The Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme.
- Work experience.
- Outdoor pursuits and sports (mountaineering, hiking, rock climbing, abseiling, caving, canoeing, mountain biking, etc.)
- Curriculum related visits, for subjects such as technology, science, P.E, geography and music.
- Cultural visits.

HOUSE SYSTEM

The house system is a very important part of Academy life. Over the course of the year, there are numerous house events. There is something to cater for everyone's interest. The four houses are Snowdon, Bredon, Malvern and Clent - students are placed into a house when they start at Forge and compete over the academic year.



SEA CADETS

Whether at sea or on land, the Sea Cadets offers young people across the UK amazing opportunities for personal development – by learning new skills and working in teams – they offer an environment where young people find new confidence and inspiration.

Sandwell Sea Cadets are based here, at Ormiston Forge Academy. They have their own, independent base and work with our students.
