# REWARDS, SANCTIONS AND SUPPORT

### REWARDS

We love to reward those students who are 'getting it right' and making progress and we use an achievement points system (Forge Points) to encourage and reward behaviour that mirrors our Academy values. All staff at the Academy are encouraged to log Forge points for students who meet and exceed our expectations, both in and out of lessons. We endeavour to ensure ALL students that meet the rewards thresholds (bronze, silver, gold, platinum) are recognised and are in with a chance of winning prizes in our termly colobration assemblies. termly celebration assemblies.

In addition to our Forge Points there are a number of other ways in which students will be recognised for their positive behaviour, these are:

Feel Good Friday emails/phonecalls

Verbal praise

•Communicating praise to parents via a phone call or written correspondence (postcards/letters of commendation)

 Vouchers (x2 per lesson maximum)
 Certificates, badges, prize draw raffles and special assemblies
 Posițions of responsibility, such as Form Captain or being entrusted with a particular decision or project

•Whole-class or year group rewards, such as trips and enrichment activities •Annual Awards Evening

### SANCTIONS & SUPPOR

We follow a graduated response (Warning, B1, B2, B3 etc) to incidents of poor behaviour or when a student fails to meet our expectations. Part of our sanctions system includes the use of after school detention however, important to state that a detention is a last resort for us, we don't want to issue any, but there needs to be a consequence of actions. Same day detentions ensure that students can start the following day with a clean slate.

We want to give students every chance to succeed and it's important that issues don't hang over them. Parents will be informed about detentions via EduLink. If a detention is not convenient, we are happy to have the conversation about moving but we need your support with this.

Our detentions will be staffed by our pastoral staff and senior leadership team and it will be based in classrooms. We encourage staff to come to the detention for restorative conversations with students. Students undertake work that allows them to reflect upon their behaviour.

It is essential that we support students who are struggling with aspects of their behaviour. Therefore, pastoral staff regularly monitor student behaviour and will ensure support is implemented for students where concerns arise. The support offered to students' can include parental meetings, targeted reports, behaviour and SEN interventions, timetable amendments and external support.

# BACK TO BASICS

At Forge, we've always taken great pride in preparing our young people for the world beyond the Academy - into work, apprenticeships or further education. We provide our students with a framework in which they can learn, we call this BASICS - we want our students to simply get the basics right.



### E ON TIME

•Being on time is fundamental component to success and demonstrates the respect and commitment you have for yourself and others, therefore:

•All students are expected on school site at 8.35am and to be sat in form or assembly by 8.40am. Both side gates will close at 8.35am. Any student arriving after 8.40am will have to sign in at reception and may receive an after- school detention depending upon the circumstances surrounding the lateness

•All students are expected to arrive to lessons on time to ensure learning and progress is maximised. A student is considered late to lessons anytime they arrive after the formal start time of the lesson and there are no excuses as there is 5 minutes' walk time between each lesson.



### TTEND EVERY DAY

• We expect students to have high Aspirations linked to their attendance as students who attend school are more likely to be safe and successful. We therefore expect students to have 100% attendance to school.

• Attendance is discussed in form every Monday and students are regularly rewarded for meeting attendance targets.

Parents can track attendance using EduLink (see our Apps section later).



#### MARTLY DRESSED

 We prepare students for the world of work by insisting on high expectations linked

to uniform and appearance. We expect students to adhere to our uniform policy, look professional and show 'Pride in the Badge', therefore:

• Full uniform is expected to be worn correctly (shirts tucked in and ties done up) for every student at all times. Form tutors will check every morning along with classroom teachers who will check at the start and end of lessons. Students wearing incorrect uniform will be loaned uniform from school.

• We will contact home if a student does not have the correct uniform and as always, we will support families who are struggling to provide the correct uniform.

 Items of clothing and jewellery outside of our uniform policy may be confiscated and brought to the main office or respective keystage offices to be collected at the end of the school day.



### NSTRUCTIONS FOLLOWED

•The adults within our school are the authority figures and any instructions given by them are expected to be followed without question. Our school rulesare designed to keep studentssafe and promote fairness and consistency whilst also creating an effective learning environment.

During the lesson's all students:

•Engage fully with learning • Listen in silence to staff instructions •Complete all tasks set.

At the end of the lesson, all students:

 Pack away in a calm, orderly manner •Stand behind chairs with coats on •Wait in silence for staff to dismiss.

Out of lesson, all students:

•Move sensibly along the corridor and act respectfully in all areas of the school and towards each other. Follow one-way systems where appropriate • Go straight to the next lesson.

Students will be given every opportunity to get this right without consequence but there will be a ladder of escalation linked to our sanction system for students who challenge adult instruction or do not meet our expectations.



### OME EQUIPPED

Students at Ormiston Forge are organised and prepared for their learning as it is essential for learning and success. As such we expect all students to carry a school bag and pencil case to hold at least one pen. pencil, ruler and rubber as basic equipment. Students are also expected to have additional equipment when needed such as PE Kit and ingredients for DT Food.

• Form tutors will conduct regularly equipment checks and will support students by providing any missing equipment. For those students who

are persistently withoutthe correct

equipment pastoral intervention will take place and sanctions may be imposed.



### **HOW RESPECT**

 Respect is one of our core valuesand a fundamental right for every student and staff member at Ormiston Forge. At all times:

 Students will demonstrate Respect for themselves by attending school on time and giving themselves the best opportunities to be successful. Students will treat others and the community in ways in which they

would want to be treated.

 Student will show Respect to their teacher and fellow classmates by engaging in the learning at all times and treat others as they wouldwant to be treated.

There will be a number of form activities, PSHE lessons and intervention sessions surrounding the theme of respect and students and staff will continue to work closely together on this.

### UNIFORM

### MAKE-UP

Make-up and nail varnish are not permitted in years 7, 8 and 9. Discrete make-up and nail varnish is permitted for years 10 and 11. False nails and eyelashes are not permitted.

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### **PE KIT**

#### Compulsory clothing:

- •Black/burgundy polo shirt with Academy logo.
- •Plain black football style shorts (cycling style shorts are only to be worn underneath football shorts)
- •Plain black tracksuit bottoms (discreet logo is acceptable) OR black tracksuit bottoms supplied via our approved online supplier. Leggings are allowed to be worn underneath football shorts.
- Plain black football socks (outdoor)
- •Plain white sport socks (indoor)
- Appropriate footwear for the activity; suitable trainers for indoors and sturdy trainers or moulded stud boots for the astroturf

Often students need to go outside in all weather conditions. They're required to be fully prepared for these conditions with clothing that ensures they are as comfortable as possible whilst still upholding our PE kit standards.

### **JEWELLERY**

Students are not allowed to wear excessive or expensive jewellery at Ormiston Forge Academy. This is not only to prevent the loss of valuable items but also to encourage neatness in dress and appearance. If studs are worn, only one pair can be worn in earlobes. Nose studs are permitted but not nose rings.

ALL JEWELLERY MUST BE REMOVED FOR PE DUE TO HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS.

It is important that your children get the same, consistent message on high expectations. Your reinforcement of these expectations is really helpful to us.

### **PARTNERSHIP**

We work best when communication between us is strong. You can always email us using the contact form on the websiteto discuss any concerns or issues. We will get back to you within24 hours to discuss the matter you have raised.

Over the course of your time at Forge, you are likely to require some support from our dedicated pastoral team. In year 7 you have a whole raft of options, from your progress tutor to your pastoral leader.

If, as a parent, you would like to speak to a member of the pastoral team, we will be happy to help and will ensure we get back to you to address your concerns within 24 hours.

### **FIZZY DRINKS**

All fizzy and energy drinksare banned at Forge.

If fizzy drinks and/or energy drinks such as Red Bull, Relentless, Monster Energy and Rockstar are found on site, they will be disposed of.

Please support us in ensuring that your children don't have access to these drinks and encourage them to drink water, squash or healthier alternatives.

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### **HOMEWORK & STUDY**

**READING** forms the foundation of learning. Listening to your child read for 20 minutes each day has been proven to have a positive impact on academic outcomes.

MULTIPLICATION TABLES - Going through these regularly with your child will really help their progress in Maths.

In key stage 3, students learn to spell, define and use in context key words for each subject. Students also have the opportunity to complete a DEEP LEARNING PORJECT each half term in one subject area: these are an opportunity for parents, grandparents, students and school to work together extending knowledge across the curriculum. Students are also expected to complete regular Maths and science guizzes and to read for pleasure.

### **MOBILE PHONES**

Mobile phones and earphones/earbuds are no longer permitted on site at any point during the school day (including when leaving the site). If seen they are to be confiscated and sent to the office for collection at the end of the day. Sanctions will be recorded on SIMS for any misuse.

The Academy will not be responsible for any loss, damage or theft of devices brought

onto the premises.

SOCIAL MEDIA There are rarely issues here that start inside the Academy. If your child has access to the likes of Facebook, WhatsApp, Snapchat and Instagram, we would encourage you to monitor their usage. You should also note that under 14s are not permitted to use any social media or have accounts.

## APPS AND STAYING CONNECTED

Our apps will give you daily updates and let you know how your child is getting on at Forge. You will receive regular progress updates at parent consultation evenings and via progress reports. For year 7, we have a settling-in evening after the first half term where you can meet your child's tutor and discuss progress.
