In 2015, I received my GCSE results and did much better than I had expected. I knew I wanted to eventually study Astrophysics at university, particularly because I really enjoyed the GCSE Physics course. I also knew staying on at the Forge was the right decision for me as I knew the close community that staff foster in the sixth form would help me immensely.
