
Optional subjects

English is invaluable for your future, no matter what you are aiming for. A good command of the spoken and written word will help you every day of your life. Whatever you end up doing, English is a must have subject for college, university, work and life!

What will I study?

You will analyse how writers use language and structure to present their ideas in a range of fiction and non-fiction texts. You will also have the opportunity to write creatively and in non-fiction scenarios, communicating your ideas effectively. Skills that you learn here will also help with your study of English Literature.

All examinations are tier-less, meaning that there is no limit to the grade you can achieve!

How will I be assessed?

This qualification will be assessed through two written examinations at the end of year 11, both of which are compulsory. All texts in this examination will be unseen.

Paper 2: Writers' viewpoints and Perspectives All tasks will be linked thematically	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In Section A, you will answer four compulsory questions about two unseen texts taken from different eras, including the 19th century; one shorter question, two longer questions that ask you about both texts and one extended question that will ask you to compare aspects of both texts. In Section B, you will be asked to write a specified non-fiction text in which you will be asked to present your own point of view about a given subject. 	1hr 45mins	June 2028	50%

Speaking and listening - Non Examination Assessment

The skill of presenting points of view and responding to questions will be assessed by your teacher. It remains a compulsory component of the qualification but will not form part of your final grade. Instead, it will be a separate endorsement on your certificate.
